The CIF was established in 1993 to provide financial assistance to students preparing for careers in the design and construction industry, with special emphasis on study related to concrete.

The Foundation provides scholarships and grants for study at the graduate, undergraduate, technical college and apprentice levels to residents of the New York City Metropolitan Area who are studying at accredited schools and programs in the area.

The Foundation's work is supported by contributions from the design and construction industry, in particular from those involved in the many phases of concrete design and production.

The Concrete Industry Board, Inc.

In 1951, the Concrete Industry Board Inc., a non-profit organization, was born out of an extreme need to achieve quality in concrete. Founded by late industry leader Roger H. Corbetta, it has prevailed for almost 70 years in pursuing the highest industry standard of quality in the design and construction of concrete work in the New York Metropolitan area. The CIB is the New York City Chapter of American Concrete Institute (ACI).

The organization's major goals are to foster the highest quality design and construction of concrete structures through technical education, exchange and debate. The CIB also distributes pertinent information provided by the ACI, CRSI, ASTM, and other organizations relative to design criteria, materials, testing procedures and construction practices together with regulations which will foster plain and reinforced concrete of the highest quality.

The CIB's Roger H. Corbetta Annual Awards Program to honor Quality Concrete, now in its 58th year, is an annual showcase of the best of the best in concrete design and construction.
